MOTT 32



Mott 32 is named after 32 Mott Street in NYC where the city's first Chinese convenience store was located. The restaurant serves mainly Cantonese with a few Sichuan and Beijing dishes. One of the city's hottest Chinese restaurants.

CARBONE



Carbone Hong Kong is a New York-Italian restaurant that pays homage to the essence of the great Italian restaurant of mod-20th century in New York. The food nods to that same history, but take culinary cues from the great talents and techniques of the present and future.

ARBOR



A French fine-dining restaurant with chefs Nicolas Boutin and Eric Rätty at the helm. Serving up innovative dishes in a forest themed surroundings, Arbor makes for a perfect tranquil getaway in the heart of Central. You can also wind down with a brunch every weekend.

AMMO



Tapas and comfort foods are the flavours du jour. Expect a pleasant surprise in every dish: traditional Spanish flavours are juxtaposed with innovative concoctions that complement each other in surprising ways.

YARDBIRD



Yardbird is a hipster's ode to the chicken. Every part of the cluck-cluck, from thigh to gizzard, is seasoned, impaled with a stick then grilled, yakitori-style. The resulting skewers are flavourful with just the right consistency. It's highly popular and doesn't take reservations, so sample the sakes in the convivial bar area while you wait for a table.

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BARS

BAR LEONE



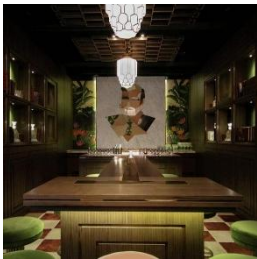
Opened in June 2023 by multi award-winning Italian bartender Lorenzo Antinori, Bar Leone's meteoric rise to success can be attributed to two things: a great bar programme and an even greater sense of humour.

SAVORY PROJECT



A unique and ever-evolving bar concept located in the heart of Hong Kong's Soho district. Founded by the award-winning team behind COA, The Savory Project is a celebration of complex and nuanced flavours.

THE OLD MAN



The Old Man honours Hemingway by taking inspiration from his novels, history, and folklore, and by using novel ingredients and culinary accoutrements – thereby paying tribute to the spirits and cocktails he loved.

COA



COA was opened in 2017 by Jay Khan as part of his mission to bring agave spirits to the forefront of Asia's cocktail scene. Named after the machete like tool for harvesting agave, COA (co-ah) is inspired by the drinking dens Jay frequented on his trips to Mexico.

PENINCILLIN



Hong Kong's first closed loop cocktail bar, local and upcycled ingredients steal the spotlight in its menu, as well as a range of organic ferments from the bar's in-house climate-controlled fermentation enclosure, also fondly known as 'The Stinky Room'.

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CLUBS

DRAGON - I



Dragon-I opened its doors in 2002 and has established itself as one of Hong Kong's most vibrant and exclusive clubs. Its interiors blend traditional and contemporary Asian elements with red phoenix-print lanterns elegantly suspended from the ceiling.

SOUND DEPARTMENT



A club rooted in the energy of nightlife culture and its ability to bring people together and create hysterical memories for them. Champagne, wild crowd, bass; where music, like-minded people and excitement seekers meet.

OMA



OMA is an electrifying underground club in Lan Kwai Fong attracting clubbers with pulsating electronic, techno and house DJ beats since 2014. It has been continuously evolving and reinventing itself, occupying a key position within the city's underground electronic music scene.

BOOMERANG



Boomerang first opened its door back in Halloween 2020 before having to temporarily shut down amidst the height of the pandemic. Since re-opening their doors again however, word has spread like wildfire throughout Hong Kong's nightlife scene, earning them raving reviews and making this club the epicenter of all Hong Kong's hype.

FAYE



A quite new addition to the Hong Kong rooftop scene, FAYY (previously Faye) is found on the 25th and 26th floor of California Tower, taking over the space from CÉ LA VI. Stylish yet a bit quirky, the rooftop comes with both a Carousel horse and outer-space gimmicks, at the sleek interior lounge and at the spacious outdoor deck. Here you are also surrounded with some truly smashing city views.
